- The job of a volunteer?




Millennium Greens

- 1996 245 Space sucessfully created/restored.
- Involved local people, established local trusts.
- Funding short term.
- Management of greens is now a liability?
- Who picks up the tab?
- Many have fallen into disrepair.
- Others search for the next hand out even the successful ones.
- Problems of on going management have now been acknowledged.
- But it simply doesn't have to be this way.



The Land Trust



- Holds land for public benefit forever;
 - (also interim Management)
- Endowment Funding;
 - (or other sustainable source eg. service charge, renewable energy).





The Current Portfolio



- Currently own 21 sites managed at a local level by:
 - Wildlife Trusts.
 - RSPB
 - Local Authority
 - Community groups.
- Objective community benefit and community involvement.
- Providing advice, managing risk support and holding funds.



Our Approach the Small "o"



- Empowering communities to take 'ownership' of the project, from design to delivery and beyond.
- Removing the hurdles.
- Allowing the community to focus on the achievable not the painful!
- Ensures that future generations are still involved rather than creating a transient band of disillusioned and disenfranchised volunteers.
- Emotional ownership without the liabbilities.



The Big Society in Action



- Over 17,000 school children on educational activities.
- Over 20,000 people on structured health activities.
- Over 6000 Training Activities
- Over 23,000 community events including innovative projects working with children with 'behaviour problems.'
- Over 3 000 volunteer days.



It Also Makes Commercial Sense

- Exit route for non core land to amenity activity.
- Protection & maintenance of asset value.
- Generating increased rental value.
- Creating value for the wider economy.
- Removes the risk to reputation, sustainability or credibility.
- Releases burden of operational management (cost/time).
